Endgame technique isn't easy at the end of a rapid game. A natural sequence like 49.b2-b4 a5xb4 50.a3xb4 c5xb4 51.c3xb4 is a serious error, as Black holds because there is no way for the White king to approach. However,

Grischuk knows his onions and transfers his rook backwards behind the 'b' pawn so he can recapture with this piece. 49... Ba2-h1 50.Re7-e2
