Blitz match *quarantees* a fast start

The organisers of the Tal Memorial in Moscow introduced a clever innovation by replacing the drawing of lots with a blitz tournament

This seems guite logical as the advantage of the extra White due to the odd number of rounds goes to the players who prove adept at the fastest form of the game.

Black's position looks solid enough, but Carlsen spots that by swapping darksquared bishops he will open up entry spots into Black's position. 16.Qd1-e1

In this game the position appears balanced, but White has a clear-cut long-term plan of advancing his pawns on the kingside, while Black

finds it more difficult to strengthen his position. 15.f2-f4 Qe8-f7 16.Rh1-f1 Ra8-e8 17.Qe3-d2 Nc6-b4 18.Bd3-e4 Bd7-c6 19.Rd1-e1 Вс6хе4 20.Nc3xe4 Qf7-c4 21.a2-a3 Nh4-c6

I prefer 21...Nb4-d5. The knight is not happy on c6. 22.Qd2-c3 Qc4-d5 White keeps some initiative after 22...Qc4xc3 23.Ne4xc3 a7-a6 24.g2-g4, but Black should definitely grab the opportunity to swap queens. Ne7-f5 23.Nb3-d2
