It has been a busy period for national championships. with heavyweight all-play-all events in the Ukraine and Russia. The lack of a similar event in England remains a big problem. Top seed Ruslan Ponomariov wasn't in good form, but won an interesting game full of cut and thrust:

Black has good compensation for the pawn with his well-placed pieces and he correctly continues incisively.

It's understandable Moiseenko didn't fancy 21.Nb5-d4 g5xf4 22.Bg3-h4 f4-f3 23.a2xf3 Qc8-e8, but now he is in trouble.

21... a5xf4 22.Ne2xf4 Nd3xf4 23.Ba3xf4 Rf8xf4 24.Nc3-d5 Rf4-f5 Not 24...Bb7xd5 25.Qb3g3+.

25.Qh3-h3 Black also wins after 25.Qb3-a3+ Rf5-a5 26.Nd5f6+ Ka8-h8 27.Qa3-c3 Qc8xe6 28.Nf6xe4+ Ra5-a7 29.Ne4xc5 Qe6-c6.

25... Qc8xe6 26.Nd5xc7 Qe6-a6

The best way to unleash the monstrous power of the bishop pair was 26...Qe6-e5 27.Nc7xa8 e4-e3 28.f2xe3 Bc5xe3+ 29.Kg1-h1 Rf5-h5.

27.Nc7xa8 Bb7xa8 It was still better to play 27...e4-e3, but the line 28.f2xe3 Bc5xe3+ 29.Kg1h 1 Rf5-h5 30.Rf 1-f6 Qa6-a7 31.Qh3-e6+ Kg8-h7 32.Rf6f3 Be3-f4 33.h2-h3 Bb7xa8. is very difficult to calculate.

29.Rd1-d7 After 29.Qh3-q3 swapping gueens. Black would have to work a lot harder to win the game.

13.a2-a4 Andreikin puts the tempo to good use, storming the barricades on the kingside.

defender, which would also be the answer to many other moves, is the justification of his last move. Qd8-c7 18...Nf6xh7 19.Bd3xh7+ Kg8xh7 20.Qe2-h5+ Kh7-
