Christmas Day upset for London

The FIDE World Cities Championship is a hit of a misnomer. Intended to be held every two vears, it consists of teams assembled along national lines, as at the Olympiad. with no links required to the city represented.

The London team were beneficiaries of a dubious decision to promote the modestly-rated host team to the top seeding bracket, but after this eased qualification from their group they were eliminated by Athens on Christmas Day in the first knockout round.

16.Ra1-b1 Nd7-c5 17.Nf5xd6 c7xd6 18.Qa4-a5+ Kd8-c8 The king should be shuffling in the other direction 18...Kd8-e8 19.Rb1xb7 Oa5-d8 20 Oa5-b5+ Ke8-f8 21.Rf1-b1 g7-g6 evacuates the danger zone.

20.Bd3-f5+ Kc8-b8 21.Rf1-h1 q7-q6 22.Rb5xc5 Seizing the opportunity to remove the powerful horse, and after the subsequent pawn sacrifice, opening up a devastating diagonal for the bishop.
