Hou Yifan cruises to the title

Hou Yifan completed a surprisingly easy victory over Anna Ushenina 5.5-1.5 to regain the Women's World Championship, The Chinese Grandmaster is very comfortable in the matchplay format and was rarely in trouble, again going undefeated, as she did in her match two years earlier against Humpy Koneru.

One feature of the match was that Ushenina frequently reached positions where she had the bishop pair against Hou Yifan's bishop and knight. as in last week's game, but was unable to exploit this. Here Black's knight is already a thorn in White's side:
